WORLD MISSIONS SUPPORTS MISSION WORK:

- in **Africa**, where missionaries partner with national church bodies in eight countries and are exploring outreach in ten additional locations throughout the continent;
- in **Asia-Oceania**, where 17 missionaries partner with God's people to equip, encourage, and empower others to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to the billions still lost in darkness;
- in **Europe**, where missionaries partner with national churches to train the next generation of church leaders and bring the true gospel to countries without a strong Lutheran presence;
- in **Latin America**, where tens of thousands of people are being reached through *Academia Cristo* online courses and more than 35 individuals are actively leading a group in worship and study;
- through **Multi-Language Productions**, which has produced materials in 56 languages and reaches tens of thousands of English-speakers in 32 different countries through the TELL online training platform;
- and on **Native American reservations**, where the gospel is being shared on the Apache reservations in Arizona and the Native Christian Network has begun outreach to additional tribes.

AFRICA

The WELS One Africa Team currently works with established church bodies in Cameroon, Ethiopia, Kenya, Malawi, Nigeria, Tanzania, Uganda, and Zambia, partnering in outreach and assisting with theological education programs. The team is also working with groups, exploring outreach, and following up on contacts identified through Multi-Language Production's TELL program in 20 additional African countries. Eight missionaries serve on the One Africa Team and an additional Multi-Language Productions missionary based in Zambia oversees the TELL Africa program.

Faces of Faith – Bishop Kaaya

The leader of the Africa Mission Evangelism Church (AMEC), Bishop Baltazar Zakayo Kaaya, is a gentle soul. I've always been impressed by his respect for others, even if they don't agree with him. **He shows care and concern for the individual.** This has made him a valuable leader in the years after a split with the much larger Evangelical Lutheran Church of Tanzania, which AMEC broke away from in the 1990s.

Bishop Kaaya has worked to make AMEC a distinctively Lutheran church body, founded on Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions. He has led AMEC through the process of getting to know WELS and its representatives on the One Africa Team and has also worked with his leaders to create a written confession of faith document and constitution that are faithful to the biblical principles he holds dear.

When you hear the title bishop and see the clothing Bishop Kaaya wears for a church service, you may instinctively think "Roman Catholic," but you would be wrong. Though the church has adopted some more formal practices in this regard, their teaching and practice remain true to Scripture. It's been a joy to work with AMEC and with Bishop Kaaya in particular. I pray that the Lord will continue to bless his efforts to lead the saints there for as long as he is able!

Faces of Faith – Pastor Joseph

Four times a year, up to 30 pastors and future pastors from Obadiah Lutheran Synod in Uganda gather for two weeks of training and encouragement. We called our study of John's gospel "We have a better story."

And that we do. We have a better story than those lying about Jesus, those leading people away from God. We have a better story: Jesus is God's eternal Son. He died for all. He lives and reigns. Soon he will reappear. By believing in him we have life in his name.

Pastor Joseph was sharing his own story with us all in the tent during one of our trainings. He used to submit to Allah. He used to wear a tight-fitting cap—sometimes called a kufi—to show his submission. Then he took the cap off and started trusting Jesus. It fascinated the brothers in

the tent. What happened next? "Oh, I got threats," Pastor Joseph grinned. And yet, Pastor Joseph still follows Jesus, and he leads others to follow Jesus too—with a smile. Nobody in the tent made everyone laugh more than he did.

May Pastor Joseph's Spirit-given smile make you glad too. **Share your joy.** We have a better story! The best story.

The **One Africa Team** is having doctrinal discussions with church bodies in Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Democratic Republic of the Congo, Ethiopia, and Liberia.

Fast Facts

- There are **1,450+** active TELL students in **23** different countries throughout Africa.
- There are **7** TELL students enrolled in the multiplication level of the program who are actively leading groups or assisting in ministry at established churches.
- WELS' sister synods throughout Africa currently have **97** men enrolled in pre-seminary training in **7** different countries. This training is led by **17** African national pastors.
- One Africa Team missionaries are learning **French** and **Swahili** to assist in outreach to new groups.

CENTRAL AFRICA MEDICAL MISSION

The Central Africa Medical Mission (CAMM) oversees the Lutheran Mission Rural Health Centre, a permanent clinic in Zambia, and the Lutheran Mobile Clinic in Malawi, where staff travels to four designated villages for a day of clinical work and care. Both clinics provide Christian counseling and education, HIV testing and treatment, malaria treatment, pediatric wellness checks and immunizations, and treatment of other minor injuries or illnesses. CAMM has also partnered with other African sister synods to offer short-term medical camps in Kenya. CAMM is blessed to partner with the Lutheran Church of Central Africa, other sister synods in Africa, and WELS missionaries to serve the spiritual and physical needs of people in Africa.

Faces of Faith – Anthony

Anthony Kasonga, a Zambian national, works at the Lutheran Mission Rural Health Centre in Zambia as a medical laboratory technologist. Mr. Kasonga manages the lab and assists Mr. Jackson Kalekwa, clinical officer in charge, in overseeing clinic staff. With a diploma in biomedical science, he was inspired to pursue his career due to his love for microbiology. The faith-based nature of the Centre appeals to him, and his favorite phrase is **“We treat, and God heals.”**



Mr. Kasonga's favorite Bible verse is John 14:1, “Do not let your hearts be troubled. You believe in God; believe also in me,” which comforts him in times of trouble. He is often thanked by patients he meets in various settings, motivating him to always give his best. He acknowledges the blessings from supporters and the importance of showing kindness and God's love to patients.

Fast Facts

- The Lutheran Mobile Clinic in Malawi saw **61,700 patients** in 2024 and acquired a new ambulance.
- CAMM partnered with the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ-Kenya (LCMC-Kenya) to provide an inaugural **medical camp** in 2024, leading to the establishment of two daughter churches by St. Peter's Church in Karima, Kenya.
- In 2019, only four African staff members were Lutherans. That number has now increased to **11**.
- Clinic administrators in Malawi and Zambia earned their **master's degrees** in hospital administration and public health, respectively, with support from CAMM.



ASIA-OCEANIA

The Asia-Oceania Team comprises 17 missionaries serving 18 different countries throughout Asia and Oceania. The team—with members in Thailand, Hong Kong, the Philippines, and Australia—partners with God's people to equip, encourage, and empower others to bring the good news of Jesus Christ to the billions still lost in darkness. The Asia-Oceania Team explores new mission opportunities, supports existing sister synods, and trains current and future leaders through Asia Lutheran Seminary for service in their churches.

Faces of Faith—Brother Yong



Imagine one night you're eating at a friend's elderly mother's house. You, a church leader, and a few of your members enjoy fellowship and a homemade meal. Suddenly there's a knock at the door. In come the FBI, the CIA, and a SWAT team. They put you all in the back of their squad cars, drive you downtown for questioning, and release you hours later. But they promise they'll be watching you and visiting again.

This is what happened to Brother Yong in one of our sister churches in Asia. The Asian equivalent of these

government departments came to question him and the other church leaders—for “gathering illegally,” to worship together.

Despite this, by God's grace, Brother Yong and his whole church still find opportunities to gather. They still preach, and they still baptize new members. Fear and threats have not stopped them. **Though they face fiery trials, the Word burns brighter and hotter within them.**

Please pray for those who face persecution in churches around the world, especially in Asia.

Faces of Faith – Ramdin



Ramdin is from a tribe in a South Asian country. He had eye problems and could not see properly for many years. He went to an eye clinic, but the doctor said he could not help him. He started visiting many temples, asking religious people to bless his eyes. While traveling,

he found a Christian who shared the good news of Jesus with him. Then the Christian prayed for him. His eyesight improved, and Ramdin became a believer in Jesus.

He devoted himself to Jesus. He used to walk over eight miles each Saturday to attend worship. When he became a Christian, there were no other believers in his village, so he began a church in his house. Now others have joined him in the kingdom of God. He is so happy to welcome believers into his house.

FROM A LOCAL LEADER IN SOUTH ASIA

Faces of Faith – Wynn

Throughout her life, Wynn had sporadic encounters with God's Word. She attended Christian primary and secondary schools, where pastors would occasionally visit. Later, friends and co-workers would sometimes bring her along to church. Sometimes Wynn accepted these invitations, and sometimes she rejected them.

But God never gave up—he was unrelenting in his pursuit of Wynn, continuing to bring her in contact with his Word.

During COVID, Wynn began attending an English worship service in Hong Kong.

Shortly afterward, she moved to the United Kingdom to study abroad. She found herself spending many hours alone in her apartment after the pandemic shut down in-person classes. With time on her hands, Wynn began to pray earnestly, asking God for opportunities to serve him. When she returned to Hong Kong, she joined a local congregation of WELS' sister synod, South Asian Lutheran Evangelical Mission (SALEM). In 2022, Wynn was baptized and confirmed.



God heard, remembered, and answered Wynn's prayer to serve him. Her congregation invited her to help with a summer Bible camp for kids. Soon after, Wynn was asked to be a Sunday school teacher—and now, she teaches the Bible to children on Saturdays as well.

EUROPE

The Europe mission team partners to share Christ's grace in Albania, Bulgaria, the United Kingdom, Portugal, Russia, and Ukraine while supporting sister church bodies in seven additional European countries. Two WELS missionaries reside in Europe.

Faces of Faith - Erik

Erik Pozzato was born and raised in Roman Catholic Italy. "As a boy, I did what everyone did. I studied in confirmation class, got confirmed, and had a big party," he shares. "Then I left the church."

Erik married Michela, and they moved to Sweden. They were curious about the spiritual world and began dabbling in Masonry and the occult. Evil spirits started troubling Erik's family in obvious ways. They were afraid. That's when Michela said, "We need protection. We need help from God."



They found a local pastor to bless their house, but that wasn't the answer. Then Erik came across a Lutheran pastor online. "The pastor taught us that we are saved by grace alone, through faith in Scripture alone. It was what we were waiting for!" Jesus came into the family's home and hearts, and the demons left. **"Faith alone cleared up everything for me. When we put on the whole armor of God, the devil can't hurt us,"** Erik says.

Today Erik and his family are members of WELS' sister church, LBK-Sweden. Erik landed his dream job, and he's also studying for ministry. "When I think about my life and what Jesus did for us, I cannot be silent! I have to share this with everyone."

Fast Facts

- Weekly worship services are held at three different locations in the United Kingdom, and average weekly attendance increased from 12 in 2023 to **47** in 2024.
- The European region of the **Confessional Evangelical Lutheran Conference (CELC)** met for their annual conference in Nerchau, Germany, in May 2025, with 11 countries represented.
- Thirteen men from six countries registered for the **European Summer Quarter class** in Ljungby, Sweden, in June 2025.
- In July 2024, 180 people from 7 countries gathered in Hjälmargården, Sweden, to celebrate the 50th anniversary of WELS' sister church, the **LBK-Sweden**.



LATIN AMERICA

The One Latin America Team uses *Academia Cristo*, an online outreach and training tool, to share God's grace with as many people as possible as well as to identify and train potential leaders who can plant churches. Ten missionaries serve on the One Latin America Team.



Faces of Faith—Viriana

During the pandemic, churches in Argentina closed their doors, and I felt something was missing. I had always read the Bible, but I longed to truly understand God's message. With time on my hands, I searched for online Bible studies, carefully avoiding groups that didn't align with Scripture.

That's when I found *Academia Cristo*. The self-study course caught my attention with its biblical questions. It was a study that was rooted entirely in God's Word. I was so eager that I finished the course in just a day and a half. Then came an invitation to a live class. I signed up right away.

My first course, *The Word Grows: Disciple*, changed everything. **I realized I was a disciple of Christ, called to grow in his truth.** At first, I struggled

with the idea of salvation by grace alone, as legalism is common in many churches here. But through my studies, I came to fully trust in Christ's merits, not my own works.

I never missed a class after that. I learned from incredible teachers, and by God's grace, I now teach others. Looking back, I see how God prepared me for this path. The best investment I've made is not for worldly wealth but for my soul—peace, joy, and confidence in Christ alone.

Faces of Faith - Henry

When Christ found me in November 2022, I knew almost nothing about the Christian faith. I downloaded a Bible app, and every time I opened it, I saw an ad for *Academia Cristo*. At first, I ignored it. The registration asked for my personal information, and I wasn't ready to take that step.



Months later, curiosity got the best of me. I started filling out the form. At the last moment, I hesitated and backed out. After a few more days, I committed and began studying with *Academia Cristo*. The program starts with self-paced Bible courses, where I could watch lessons and answer questions to check my understanding. At first, I skipped the videos and just tried to pass the quizzes. But near the end, I started watching the lessons and realized how much I had missed!

After completing the self-study courses, I was invited to live online classes, where I could interact with teachers and other students. Excited to learn more, I signed up for every class available. Today, I continue studying with *Academia Cristo*, and through its pastors and teachers, **I have come to know God's truth.**

MULTI-LANGUAGE PRODUCTIONS

Multi-Language Productions (MLP) has created video, audio, and print resources in 56 languages for use in global gospel outreach, with nearly three million resources distributed worldwide. It also operates the TELL Network, an online training and church multiplication program offered in English, Mandarin, Spanish, and Tagalog. Working closely with WELS world mission teams, TELL Network provides Bible study curriculum focused on leadership training for students across the globe, preparing them to gather groups, lead Bible studies, and plant churches.

Faces of Faith – Pastor Davison

“I don’t know how I was found, but the Lord found me,” Pastor Davison Mutentami of Zambia shared as he reflected on his ministry. He grew up in the church, and the Christian education he received prepared him to serve

in ways and in places he couldn’t possibly have imagined.



As a young man, Pastor Davison took on responsibility for Sunday activities in his home congregation when the WELS missionary was traveling to other church locations. He was later recommended by his congregation to study for full-time ministry. He was assigned to serve three churches in northern Lusaka

before being called back to the seminary to serve Bethel congregation and was elected to be the Lutheran Church of Central Africa-Zambia synod chairman. He went on to serve a congregation in the Copperbelt for several years before arriving at his current ministry in Chongwe.

Pastor Davison became involved with TELL Network in 2020. He has recorded devotional material and helped produce videos that are part of the curriculum. By God’s grace, he will take on a new role in 2025 as a TELL counselor, encouraging and equipping TELL students to share what they’ve learned with others. Through this work, we pray that many others who are lost will be found and brought into the family of God.

NATIVE AMERICAN MISSIONS

The Apache mission in Arizona celebrated 125 years of God's blessings in 2018 as the first world mission of WELS. Today, WELS' Native American missions serve nine churches and two elementary schools, and it provides theological education through the Apache Christian Training School on the White Mountain and San Carlos Apache reservations in Arizona. New Native American outreach is also occurring in the Four Corners area of Arizona, New Mexico, Utah, and Colorado through the Native Christians Network.

Faces of Faith – Marlene

Mrs. Marlene Truax lets her light shine as the receptionist at East Fork Lutheran School in Whiteriver, Ariz. She's been a friendly face to students, parents, and visitors since 2016. She's been a Lutheran her whole life. She was baptized as a baby at Open Bible Lutheran Church, attended East Fork Lutheran School, and raised her family in the Lutheran church. Being a lifelong church member doesn't mean life is easy. Like many fellow Apaches, Marlene has faced some tough times. She has learned that **"God is always there, no matter what."**

Marlene's humble and faithful service supports the teaching staff on the "front lines" in the classroom. She keeps everyone organized and offers a cheerful wave to students who pass by her office. Besides keeping busy with her receptionist duties, she also functions as the school medic. She comforts hurting kids with adhesive bandages and ice packs, and always with compassion.

Known affectionately by the students as "Miss Marlene," she enjoys seeing the kids each day and watching them grow in size and in faith. "We have an excellent school because we teach God's Word," says Marlene. One of her favorite Bible verses is Matthew 5:16: "Let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." Marlene inspires me with her hard work and dedication and love for God and his Word. I'm so thankful for her!

- WELS' Native American missions are partnering with the **Native Strength Network** to address the mental health crisis in Native American communities by re-establishing **peer recovery groups** that offer culturally relevant support and foster community resilience.
- An average of **623 members** worship weekly at nine congregations on the Apache reservations.

PSI also consults with regional World Missions teams and sister churches around the world on theological education programs and coordinates advance degree programs and visiting instructors upon request.

Faces of Faith – Natinael

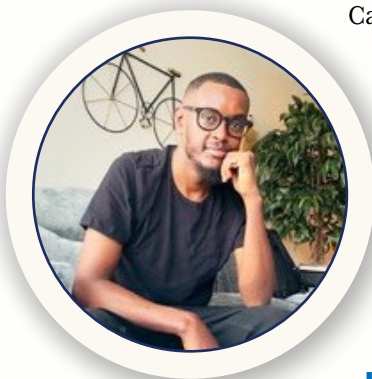
I am Natinael from Ethiopia. Because of persecution from my government, I left my home and family and came to Canada in hopes of a better life. I am now living in Calgary, Alberta,

Canada, and trying to sponsor my wife and daughter to live here with me. I grew up in a Lutheran church in Africa, so I was looking for a Lutheran church here. Sadly, while there are various Ethiopian churches in Calgary, none of them were committed to the truth of the Bible as expressed in the Lutheran tradition.

Even though there are various opportunities to worship in my own language, I was not content to compromise on my

Lutheran faith. Eventually I found St. Paul Lutheran Church in Calgary and quickly came to love the people there and their commitment to the Lutheran Confessions.

I still, however, missed worshiping in my native language, Amharic. I talked to the pastor about this and lamented the lack of Ethiopian Lutheran churches in our city. Pastor asked me, “Well, do you want to make an Ethiopian Lutheran church happen?” and I said, “Yes!” After that, I enrolled in the Pastoral Studies Institute and have been receiving training to become a pastor. Together with St. Paul, my goal is to gather my people for Bible studies and eventually plant the very first Ethiopian Lutheran Church in Calgary. Please pray that I would study faithfully and that the visa applications for my wife and daughter would be approved. I miss my family dearly.

- PSI currently trains **40** students from **13** different people groups in **31** locations throughout North America.
- PSI currently trains **310** students from **11** different people groups in coordination with WELS' five regional world mission teams.
- PSI's **Joshua Urban Ministry Program (JUMP)** in Milwaukee, Wis., is currently training eight inner-city men for the pastoral ministry.

WELS Home Missions plants new churches and assists mission-minded congregations in the United States, Canada, and English-speaking West Indies. Home Missions currently supports 144 congregations with financial subsidy or district mission board/mission counselor assistance, with 30 of those being cross-cultural mission congregations. Home Missions also provides more than 50 campus ministries with financial support while assisting hundreds of other congregations that serve college students around the United States and Canada.

Faces of Faith—Cheri

In 2025, God led a precious soul to the waters of Baptism through . . . TikTok!

Our congregation has been using a free online ad tool that connects local pastors to people in their zip code who have spiritual questions. One day Cheri was scrolling through TikTok when she saw a video ad and clicked on it. Soon, she found herself messaging with our pastor. After asking about our church's core beliefs and our worship service, she decided to attend worship the very next Sunday. A new round of Bible Basics class happened to be starting immediately after worship. Cheri agreed to try the class and was immediately hooked! She became a regular at both worship and Bible study, with a boundless appetite for asking deep spiritual questions and finding the answers in God's Word.

Cheri joined our congregation in fall 2024. She was baptized, confirmed, and received the Lord's Supper all on the same day. Now, she rarely misses a Sunday of worship, a Bible study, or any church event and has become a key volunteer on our AV team.

Who knows how many more “Cheris” might be out there right now, spending time online while longing deep down to learn more about God. **We thank the Lord for every opportunity to connect with people—even through TikTok!**

100 MISSIONS IN 10 YEARS

WELS Home Missions approved **11 new home mission starts and enhancements** in April 2025. That puts us at a total of 21 new starts and 24 enhancements as we work towards our synod's goal of starting 100 missions and enhancing 75 ministries by 2033.

NEW HOME MISSION STARTS

+ **Arlington, Tenn.:**

Arlington, located 25 miles northwest of Memphis, is on the brink of rapid growth with Ford Motor Company set to build a new plant for electric truck production. Since 2022, the South Atlantic District Mission Board has been working with a dedicated group of 60 members and Pastor Jim Turriff from Gloria Dei, Memphis, who plan to relocate and establish a fresh start in Arlington under a new name.



holding weekly worship in October 2024. The group has identified 90 prospects, many of whom they connected with by volunteering in the Jarrell Bible Community Food Pantry. The plan is to rent space for eight years before securing land and constructing a permanent church home.

+ **Madison, Wis.:**

The center of Madison is expected to grow by 200,000 in future years, with many residents seeking an urban lifestyle. A core group of 14 adults, familiar with the area, has been working together since 2022—meeting regularly for Bible study and ministry planning—and has also secured a rental space for worship and community activities. Twenty prospects have expressed a strong interest in learning more about this new mission. A new mission plant in the center of urban Madison would allow WELS to reach new people there.



+ **Erie, Colo.:** Erie, located 30 miles north of Denver, has experienced a 55 percent population increase from 2010 to 2020, with continued growth expected. The Colorado District Mission Board began exploring this area in 2022. A core group of 10 adults has been gathering for fellowship and Bible study while attending local festivals to share its plans for a new church.



So far, 25 people have expressed interest in learning more about the mission efforts.

+ **Jarrell, Texas:** Jarrell is a rapidly growing town located 44 miles north of Austin in northern Williamson County. The county has seen its population surge from 426,000 in 2010 to 671,000 in 2022, with continued growth expected.

For the past three years, Pastor Don Patterson has been working with a core group of 11, which began



+ **San Tan Valley, Ariz.:**

Located on the eastern edge of Phoenix, San Tan Valley is experiencing rapid growth with no signs of slowing down. Since 2022, the Arizona-California District Mission Board has been working with Heritage in Gilbert, Ariz., to plant a new mission in the area. A core group of 26 adults has been gathering regularly for Bible study and community events, building connections and momentum. In October 2024, they began holding regular worship services and have already identified 127 prospects interested in learning more about the new church.

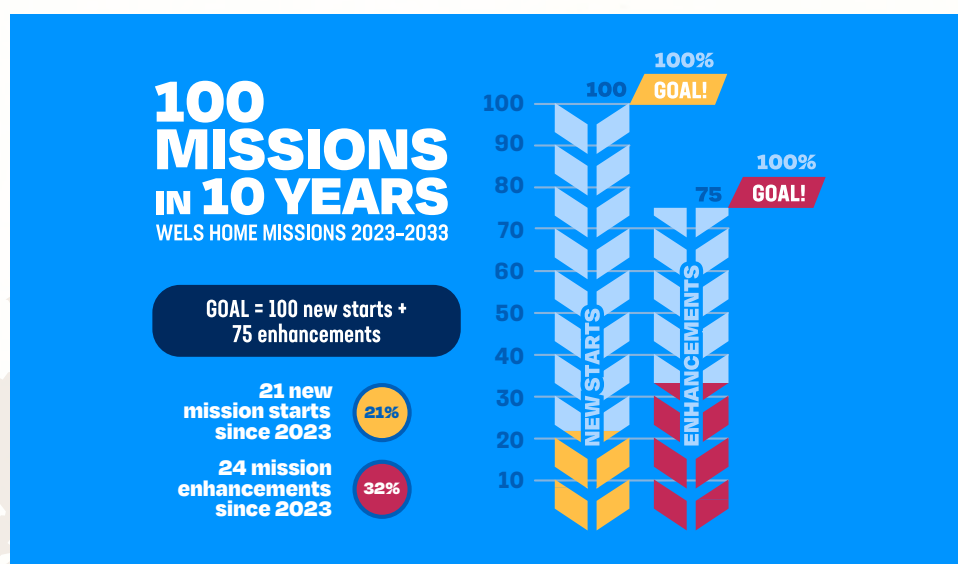

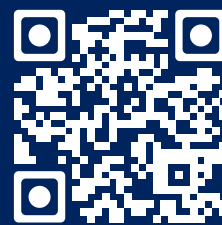

Faces of Faith – Parker

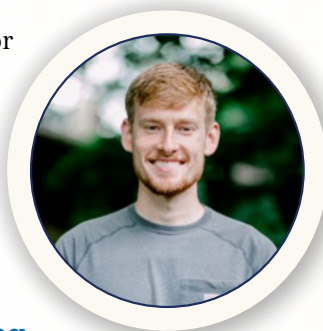
