

FIRST READING and COMMENTARY

Jonah 3:1-10

Then the word of the LORD came to Jonah a second time: ² "Go to the great city of Nineveh and proclaim to it the message I give you." ³ Jonah obeyed the word of the LORD and went to Nineveh. Now Nineveh was a very large city; it took three days to go through it. ⁴ Jonah began by going a day's journey into the city, proclaiming, "Forty more days and Nineveh will be overthrown." ⁵ The Ninevites believed God. A fast was proclaimed, and all of them, from the greatest to the least, put on sackcloth. ⁶ When Jonah's warning reached the king of Nineveh, he rose from his throne, took off his royal robes, covered himself with sackcloth and sat down in the dust. ⁷ This is the proclamation he issued in Nineveh: "By the decree of the king and his nobles: Do not let people or animals, herds or flocks, taste anything; do not let them eat or drink. ⁸ But let people and animals be covered with sackcloth. Let everyone call urgently on God. Let them give up their evil ways and their violence.

⁹ Who knows? God may yet relent and with compassion turn from his fierce anger so that we will not perish." ¹⁰ When God saw what they did and how they turned from their evil ways, he relented and did not bring on them the destruction he had threatened.


PSALM


But now that there is no more place for me to work in these regions, and since I have been longing for many years to visit you, ²⁴ I plan to do so when I go to Spain. I hope to see you while passing through and to have you assist me on my journey there, after I have enjoyed your company for a while. ²⁵ Now, however, I am on my way to Jerusalem in the service of the Lord's people there. ²⁶ For Macedonia and Achaia were pleased to make a contribution for the poor among the Lord's people in Jerusalem. ²⁷ They were pleased to do it, and indeed they owe it to them. For if the Gentiles have shared in the Jews' spiritual blessings, they owe

it to the Jews to share with them their material blessings. ²⁸ So after I have completed this task and have made sure that they have received this contribution, I will go to Spain and visit you on the way. ²⁹ I know that when I come to you, I will come in the full measure of the blessing of Christ. ³⁰ I urge you, brothers and sisters, by our Lord Jesus Christ and by the love of the Spirit, to join me in my struggle by praying to God for me. ³¹ Pray that I may be kept safe from the unbelievers in Judea and that the contribution I take to Jerusalem may be favorably received by the Lord's people there, ³² so that I may come to you with joy, by God's will, and in your company be refreshed. ³³ The God of peace be with you all. Amen.

GOSPEL and COMMENTARY

Matthew 9:35-10:4

³⁵ Jesus went through all the towns and villages, teaching in their synagogues, proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and healing every disease and sickness. ³⁶ When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷ Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. ³⁸ Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." ^{10:1} Jesus called his twelve disciples to him and gave them authority to drive out impure spirits and to heal every disease and sickness. ² These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon (who is called Peter) and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee, and his brother John; ³ Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus, and Thaddaeus; ⁴ Simon the Zealot and Judas Iscariot, who betrayed him.


Move us to support them with our sincere prayers and generous offerings.

BIOGRAPHIES

Rev. Lucas Callies

Home Missionary in North Liberty, Iowa

Lucas Callies, son of Mark and Ruth Callies, was born October 26, 1992, and baptized at Peace Lutheran Church in Hartford, Wis., on October 31, 1992. He was confirmed in the Christian faith at St. Paul's Lutheran Church in Brownsville, Wis., in May 2007. After going to high school at Winnebago Lutheran Academy in Fond du Lac, Wis. (2007-2011), he graduated from Martin Luther College in New Ulm, Minn. (B.A. 2017) and Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary in Mequon, Wis. (M. Div. 2021).

This is Lucas's first assignment out of Wisconsin Lutheran Seminary. He will join Pastor Billy King and the congregation of Good Shepherd in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, to start a second mission site in North Liberty.

He and his wife, Emily, daughter of Brian and Lori Shank, were married in St. Joseph, Mich., on June 22, 2019, at Grace Lutheran Church. Although they do not have children yet, God has blessed them with a new puppy, Nala. In mid-July, Lucas and Emily will head to North Liberty where Lucas will be installed and ordained on July 11. Rev. Isaac Hayes

Home Missionary in Milwaukee, Wisconsin
